Jeffrey A. Silver, 3960 Howard Hughes Parkway, 9th Floor, Las Vegas, represented Dr. Simon Stertzer, the applicant, and stated for some years, Dr. Stertzer had been searching for an investment that would provide additional funding for his medical research at Stanford University. Previously, Dr. Stertzer had been providing funding for his research using his own money.

Mr. Silver explained Dr. Stertzer had become a potential buyer of the business in January 2001.

Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson asked Dr. Stertzer in addition to the medical profession, had he ever invested in any other businesses in the previous two years. Dr. Stertzer responded since 1989, he had been involved in medical device development; participating in at least six start-up companies. He stated he participated in a company named Applied Vascular Engineering that went public in 1996 and was acquired by a large medical device company in 1998. In an effort to diversify the investments from that company, he and Mr. Hidalgo entered into another venture that brought them to their purchase of the subject businesses. Dr. Stertzer stated this business venture, structured into LLC's, would assist him in directing funds to the university.

Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson then asked whether local professional auditors had been retained to help establish systems of internal control for the cash intensive business. Dr. Stertzer stated controls had yet to be established because the business was not yet owned by Dr. Stertzer. Mr. Silver stated it was their intent to hire a local certified public accounting firm. Currently, Dr. Stertzer had a business investment locally with Mr. Hidalgo; Simone's Auto Body Shop. Mr. Silver felt because that business was local, there would be sufficient

contacts to contract with a local accounting firm.

Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson asked who conducted the due diligence on whether the proposed business venture was a sound investment. Mr. Silver stated the financial and tax return information were reviewed. For the past two months, Mr. Hidalgo had been employed as a shift manager by Ms. Perry. It was felt he had a sense as to whether the business was operating in a fiscally responsible manner and would be financially profitable. Mr. Silver explained since there had been several problems with the previous manager and his untimely death, the business had not been adequately promoted. He anticipated with Dr. Stertzer's and Mr. Hidalgo's involvement and their professional attitude, the business would be a success.

Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson questioned how often Dr. Stertzer would physically be on the premises. Dr. Stertzer responded it was unknown at that time but he stated he would first satisfy himself that Mr. Hidalgo, his attorneys and accountants would have the proper infrastructure so that his presence would not be necessary more than bi-monthly.

Mayor Pro Tempore stated it was understood that Dr. Stertzer would own and operate the business as a Nevada limited liability corporation. He asked if Dr. Stertzer had promised or made any agreement with anyone to sell any interest in the operation. He further asked if Dr. Stertzer had pledged or intended to pledge the LLC interests to secure financing for the purchase. Mr. Silver stated the answer to both questions was no. Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson then asked if anyone had pressured or solicited Dr. Stertzer for an interest, or a fee for assisting in the operation. Mr. Silver stated they had not been approached by anyone to pay a fee or a finder's fee with respect to this venture. He added there was a real estate broker who brought the opportunity to the applicants originally and that person would be expecting a commission but he was an employee of the business.

Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson then asked Dr. Stertzer if he understood he had the ultimate responsibility for compliance with all of the City's liquor laws and the sexually oriented business code. Dr. Stertzer stated he understood. Mr. Silver then commented the dba companies relative to the Palomino Club; Lacy's and the Satin Saddle Club should be listed as limited liability corporations.

Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson then asked Mr. Hidalgo if he had ever operated a liquor establishment, either with or without the adult entertainment. Mr. Hidalgo responded he had been employed at the Palomino Club for approximately six months and had oriented himself to the daily operations of the business. Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson then asked how Mr. Hidalgo intended to keep Dr. Stertzer involved in key decision making for the club. Mr. Hidalgo responded he communicated with Dr. Stertzer using the Internet and the telephone.

Major decisions were discussed with Dr. Stertzer and daily operational decisions were made by Mr. Hidalgo. Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson then asked Mr. Hidalgo if he was up to the challenge of running the club given the various characters and personalities that tended to want to be involved in that type of business. Mr. Hidalgo stated he was and pledged he would do everything in his power to maintain the business to the standards set by the City.

Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson stated when Mr. Paul Perry ran the business, it was conducted with an air of class and he expected the future owners and operators to adhere to the same high standards.

Councilwoman Smith asked when the business increased the marketing and advertising, consideration be given to the City and the image it is attempting to project.

Councilman Eliason requested a condition be placed on the approval that a General Manager application be on file with the City at all times.
